Kyle Matthew Ashinhurst, 48, loving father, husband, brother, uncle, and friend passed away on August 22, 2018.

Born on April 7, 1970 in West Chester, PA, Kyle was the son of Orlyn J. and Jacqueline J. (née Stipes) Ashinhurst. He was raised in Downingtown and attended The Haverford School (Class of '88). Kyle attended Trinity College in Hartford, CT, where he studied political science. Upon his return to the area, Kyle worked for several local papers as a journalist before joining The Vanguard Group as a writer and editor, enjoying a near 20-year career.

Passionate about politics and history, Kyle was always ready to share his insight. He was a fan of Star Trek, Mystery Science Theater 3000, and robots - and a self-proclaimed geek. Those who knew him were blessed by his quick wit and goofy sense of humor. Above all he had a deep love for his family.

Kyle is survived by his wife, Emily (née Norton) and their daughter, Margaret, of Havertown, PA; his brother, Timothy Ashinhurst, and sister-in-law, Linda, of Souderton, PA; his brother, Joel Ashinhurst, and sister-in-law, Michele, of Stafford, VA; nephews Christopher (with wife, Allison) and Sean; nieces Kristen (with husband, Brownlow), Jennifer, Rebecca, and Kathryn; great-nephews Jake, Cole, and Chase; and great-niece, Samantha.
