



## Virginia S. Klepfer

July 23, 1935 - December 17, 2017

Virginia Anne Snapp Klepfer, “Ginger,” from West Chester, PA passed away peacefully on December 17, 2017, surrounded by her children, at her daughter’s home in Bryn Mawr, PA. She was 82 years old. Ginger was born July 23, 1935 in Scranton, PA.
