



## Albert R. Hughes Jr.

Albert Raymond ("Bud") Hughes, Jr. died peacefully at his home in Waverly Heights, Gladwyne, PA with his family at his side on October 21st, 2015. He was 88.

Bud was born in Chicago, Illinois, Sept. 8, 1927 to Helen Andrews and Albert R. Hughes.

He was raised with his sister, Janet, in Winnetka, Illinois and graduated from New Trier High School.

He received his BA from Dartmouth College in 1949.

He served in the military in both WW2 and the Korean War.

He married Lois Jeanette Cecil of Los Angeles in 1957 and they made their home in Bronxville, NY raising their four children, Stacey, Chip, David and Jonathan. Lois passed away in 2006.

Mr. Hughes was a Senior Partner of Lord, Abbett and Co., a New York investment firm, where he retired in 1992 after 42 years at the company.

He is a former Board of Governors member of the Lawrence Hospital in Bronxville

and a past president of the United Way of Westchester.

He was also a previous member of the Board of The Community Fund of Bronxville, Eastchester and Tuckahoe.

He loved to golf and play paddle tennis and was a past President of Siwanoy Country Club,

former Board member of Ardsley Country Club, former member of the Bronxville Field Club and

Spring Lake Country Club. He was also a former member of the Metropolitan Club and the Reformed Church of Bronxville.

In 1985, Bud married June Patton Bitter of Short Hills, NJ, the mother of four daughters, and they made their home in Sea Girt, NJ and Harbour Ridge YCC, Palm City, Florida. June passed away in 2001.

Beloved father and grandfather, Bud is survived by his four children and two grandchildren,

Harry and Evelyn Hughes.
