ALBERT J. MARCELLINO, born on April 9, 1947 and died on May 31, 2013 at age 66, at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania after battling cancer for more than six years. He was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and grew up in South Philadelphia with his sister, Barbara, and parents, John and Doria (Collinelli) Marcellino and with numerous aunts, uncles and cousins in near proximity. After graduating from Southern High School, he attended Drexel University where he received a Bachelor's Degree in Mechanical Engineering. He then went to work for Curtiss Wright Corporation and also proceeded to pursue Master's Degrees in both Mechanical Engineering and Business Administration. The majority of the earlier part of his career was spent as an engineer in the Gas Turbine Division of Westinghouse Electric Corporation where he worked for 15 years. When the Gas Turbine Division relocated to Orlando, Florida in 1986, Al chose to stay in Pennsylvania and pursue a law degree at Temple University. He graduated in 1990 magna cum laude and went to work for the Intellectual Property law firm of Woodcock, Washburn in Philadelphia, subsequently becoming a partner of the firm. He married Beth Ungerman in 1987 and had two children, Peter and Julia. In addition to his work and his family, Al loved cycling on weekends, movies, preparing (and eating) pasta dishes, spending time with family and friends and, perhaps most of all, vacationing in Avalon with his children and nieces and nephews around him.
