ALDEN TUCKER of Waverly Heights, Gladwyne, PA died peacefully on August 15th, 2022 at the age of 94.

He was born in Brooklyn, NY on December 13, 1927 to the late John and Urania Tucker. He grew up on Long Island, NY and graduated from Mineola High School. He was a Veteran of World War II, served in Army of Occupation of Japan.

He graduated in 1952 from Worcester Polytechnic Institute with Bachelor of Science in

Electrical Engineering - Member of SPE Fraternity. After graduation he joined Philadelphia Electric Co. where he worked for 38 years until retiring as Senior Engineer in 1990.

He was active in Boy Scouts for 58 years, with 50 years associated with Troop 19 at Bryn Mawr

Presbyterian Church - Served as Cubmaster, Committee Chairman, Scoutmaster and Unit

Commissioner - at District level chaired both the Training and Activities Committees and

served as District Commissioner for 10 years - Awarded the District Award of Merit, Silver

Beaver and National Endowment Award.

He served on the Election Board in Radnor Township for 28 years, 20 years as Judge of Election; loved golf. member of McCall G&CC for 66 years (2018); ardent fan of Phillies, Eagles and Flyers as well as all Penn State teams.

He is survived by his wife Anne and a son Robert of Northville, MI; preceded in death by son Jeffrey and Brother John Tucker, Jr.

His Memorial Service will be held on Tuesday August 23rd. at 2 PM in the Chapel of Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church, 625 Montgomery Ave., Bryn Mawr, PA, where a reception will follow.
