



## Anita MacFarland "Teddy" Tyson

June 2, 1919 - April 18, 2008

Anita M. ("Teddy") Tyson, quietly passed away at the Inn at Freedom Village, Coatesville, Pennsylvania on April 18, 2008 from complications following a fall. Born in 1919 in Wynnewood, Pennsylvania as Anita Eileen MacFarland, Ms. Tyson lived in Narberth over 75 years, moving with her husband to Freedom Village in 1998. After attending Narberth Public School, Ardmore Junior High School and Lower Merion Senior High School, she worked as an administrative assistant for Paine, Webber, Jackson and Curtis in Philadelphia and Ralph S. Dunne, Gillis & Moore, Hudson Paper & Pulp Company and, for many years, the Clifford B. Ives Company in Narberth.

Mrs. Tyson was a member of the Welsh Valley Business & Professional Womens Club for over 49 years and served several terms as President and in various district positions. She was a Cub Scout leader, a charter member of the Narberth Community Theater and an active member of Narberth's Bicentennial Committee and active on the Fourth of July Committee. For decades, Mrs. Tyson was a long-time member of All Saints Episcopal Church in Wynnewood and for years ran the Sunday School nursery at All Saints.

Mrs. Tyson is survived by her loving husband, Chester C. Tyson, Jr.; son, Peter R. Tyson(Megan); grandchildren Holly Nicole and Timothy Everett Tyson; a brother, Richard (“Dick”) MacFarland; a sister, Margaret (“Peggy”) Martelock; three nieces, Patt Horsley Potter, Linda Martelock and Wendy Tyson; and two nephews, Scott MacFarland and Robert Tyson. She was predeceased by her parents, Margaret and Richard MacFarland, a brother, Andrew MacFarland, a sister, Isabelle Horsley, and a nephew, Andrew Horsley.

A graveside service will be held on Sat. May 3rd, 11am in the Memorial Garden at All Saints Episcopal Church, Montgomery Avenue and Gypsy Lane, Wynnewood, followed by a reception.

A memorial service will be held at Freedom Village in Coatesville, at 11:00am on May 10th.
