Audrey Herbert Feravolo, 79, (nee Brua) of Narberth and Sarasota, Florida, formerly of New Hope, retired family therapist, died peacefully on September 20 at her daughter's home.

Mrs. Feravolo, originally of New Castle, Pennsylvania, was the daughter of Arthur and Dorothy (Bolind) Brua. She was valedictorian of her graduating class at East Brook High School. She earned a bachelor's degree from Penn State University and her Masters of Social Work from Tulane University.

For more than 40 years, Mrs. Feravolo worked as a social worker and family therapist, specializing in helping children and couples. From 1982 to 2002, she had a private practice in New Hope, Pennsylvania.

Mrs. Feravolo married Dr. Rocco V. Feravolo in 1982 and they spent 25 years living and working at their brown stone cottage nestled in the side of a hill in New Hope. They created a beautiful garden there together. Mrs. Feravolo spent many hours tending the garden or reading her beloved books. They also spent many wonderful winters in Sarasota, Florida.

In addition to her husband, Mrs. Feravolo is survived by her daughter, Lynn O'Connor (Lawrence), step-daughter, Angela Bailey (Thomas), step-son, Michael Feravolo and four grand-children. Her brother John ("Jack") Brua, of Worthington Minnesota, died in 1996 but she is survived by his wife, Geraldine Brua, and their five children. She is also leaving behind many other dear relatives and wonderful friends.
