Carol Marine Pyle passed away of natural causes in the early morning of April 29th., 2021 at the age of 74.

She was born in Charleston, South Carolina on November 21, 1946. As a child her house was filled with music. Her mother Emilie was trained as a concert pianist. Her father Jack was a legendary disc jockey at WIP in the fifties.

Carol went on to graduate from Lower Merion High School and Purdue University with a degree in "Honors Physics." She was "Mortar Boarded" there and also a member of Mensa. Later she received her Masters in Business Administration from Drexel University..

Carol spent thirty two years at Rohm and Haas as a technical writer and finance manager. She retired from Rohm and Haas in 2000.

In retirement she was equally impressive...Carol was an adjunct "Professor of Finance" at Lasalle University, but her great passion was her "love affair" with the church. She was a volunteer and Trustee at Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church. Carol was an enthusiastic member of both "The Mission Committee" and "The Refugee Committee."
