



Dewees L. Stuart "Dewey"

February 24, 1927 - August 23, 2016

Dewees "Dewey" Stuart, 89, of Narberth PA passed away on Tuesday, August 23, 2016.

Dewey was born on February 22, 1927 to Herman and Mary Stuart. He is survived by his granddaughter, Brooke and his daughter-in law, Carol, and many loving nieces and nephews. He is preceded in death by his late wife, Mary "Mitzi" Stuart, his son, Ric and eight brothers and sisters.

He was an active volunteer member of The Narberth Fire Company for over 50 years and spent many years as a houseman alternating between there and his own heating service business.

Dewey joined the Navy in 1943 in the midst of World War II and soon found himself on an aircraft carrier in the South Pacific. He was a radioman and a gunner on a two-seated dive bomber called a "Helldiver", a carrier-based scout bomber. He flew 16 sorties against enemy ships and planes, and was part of three invasions, including Okinawa.

Dewey was very prominent in the sports life of Narberth. He was the Director of the Narberth Colts football club. The Colts organization sponsored teams for boys ages 9-14. With the permission of Burt Bell's widow, the name of the former Commissioner of the National League was adopted and the Burt Bell

League was born. Dewey continued to coach, and his son, Ric, was one of his players.

In 1987, he organized a group of Narberth veterans who dedicated their time to maintain the 1938 Narberth War Memorial that had become completely overgrown. Due to their dedication and hard work services are now held every Memorial Day and Veterans Day.

A celebration of Dewey's life was held at the Lower Merion Baptist Church on September 2nd, Contributions in Dewey's memory may be made to either the Narberth Fire Company or the Narberth War Memorial.
