



## Dolores Coombs

Dolores Coombs was a force of nature who never backed down from a challenge. For her, living life to the fullest was never about compensating, it was about making the most of life in her own unique, self-sufficient way. She thrived as a strong woman in man's world, and as a blind person in a sighted world. She independently navigated her own way, graduating from the Overbrook School for the Blind and the University of Pennsylvania. Subsequently, for over 40 years she walked and took public transportation from Narberth to work in Center City Philadelphia. In addition to being deeply involved in her local community, Dolores frequently traveled domestically and internationally, visiting family and friends, attending and participating in conferences and events, touring museums and cultural attractions by car, boat, bus, trolley, plane and train. Dolores was a wife, sister, aunt, and loyal friend. Among many other interests, she was also an avid reader, knitter, and teacher. Dolores was a woman of deep Christian faith. As a member of Narberth Presbyterian Church, she served as a Deacon, and Lay Shepherd, extending the love and justice of the Lord within the Church and beyond, in the community. Dolores led small group Bible Studies, and was a faithful friend in prayer. She was an inspiration and role model to many.
