



Edward Janavel Huth

May 15, 1923 - November 2, 2021

Edward Janavel Huth, 98, of Bryn Mawr died November 2, 2021, with his wife of 64 years by his side. Ed was born in Philadelphia on May 15, 1923, to Edward and Susanne Huth. He attended Haddonfield Memorial High School, Wesleyan College, and got his medical degree from the University of Pennsylvania. Ed was appointed editor-in-chief of *Annals of Internal Medicine* in 1971, raising it from a relatively obscure publication to a world-leading medical journal. He was widely known as the “dean of the American medical editors” for his many innovations in medical publishing. After retiring in 1990, he continued to write articles and books on medical editing and publishing for another 19 years, including his best known “How to Write and Publish Papers in the Medical Sciences.” Ed loved good writing, good food, and started a “Pen and Pan” society with several Main Line doctors. He also had a passion for organ music and was an accomplished piano player. Ed’s interest in history and genealogy were gifts he gave back to the community, and he was active on the boards of directors of the Luddington Library and the Harriton Association.

Ed will be lovingly remembered by his wife Carol and sons John and James. He is survived by grandchildren James, Phoebe, Charlotte, Alexander, and Elizabeth.
