

Rt. Rev. James C. Flanagan D.D.

January 12, 1939 - December 28, 2022

Rt. Reverend James C. Flanagan D.D., of Merion Station, PA passed away on December 28th, 2022 at the age of 83.

He was the bishop of the Northeast diocese of the Anglican Orthodox Church. James was born in Manhattan and raised in the Bronx. It was in the Bronx that James first became a firefighter, a lifelong passion of his. In 1961, he met the love of his life, Mary Lou Flanagan. After serving in the national guard Rainbow Division, they were married and had recently celebrated 62 years of marriage. He then later pursued an education at the College of Insurance and became employed by the state of New Jersey. During this time, James started to pursue an education in theology and ministry, receiving multiple degrees including his doctorate from Rutgers and Faith Theological Seminary. He was a minister at the Church of the Evangel in Narberth, PA for over forty years. He also ministered to Whitfield Memorial church in South Philadelphia. In addition to his congregational duties, he also volunteered as a chaplain for Lower Merion and Radnor fire companies. James was also active in veteran causes, specifically taking on multiple leadership roles for AMVETS including Post 148, Commander and Chaplain & American Legion Post 355 member and chaplain.

James is survived by his wife, Mary Lou Flanagan, son Christopher B. Flanagan and daughter Laurie L. Chiambalero. His pride in his grandchildren,

Pearce B. Flanagan, Colin S. Flanagan, Lucy Chiambalero and Charlie Chiambalero was his overwhelming joy.

His family takes comfort in one of his most beloved verses: “And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are called to his purpose” Romans 8:28.

The celebration of his life will take place at 11am on January 21st at All Saints’ Church, 1325 Montgomery Ave., Wynnewood 19096. The service will be immediately followed by the interment of his ashes in the Church’s memorial garden. A reception to greet friends and fellowship will follow the services at the Union Fire Station, 149 Montgomery Ave., Bala Cynwyd.

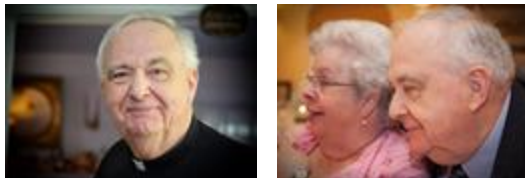
