As I was growing up, he was a role model for me as the elder male cousin I saw the most. I remember holidays when I was young at our grandmother’s (Grammy’s) house. When I was young, Jim was one of the cool “grown-up” cousins that would mingle with the adults upstairs rather than playing pretend (“Schnur family restaurant”) in the cellar with most of us younger cousins. In addition to being a role model of mature behavior, he was also a role model academically. I recall hearing from my mom about Jim graduating from either high school or college with a GPA greater than 4.0, which I didn’t even know was possible at the time. I remember thinking that Jim must be mythically intelligent in order to do that.

As I got older, Jim became less of a mystical “grown-up cousin” and I got to know Jim the person. Despite his previous mystical status in my mind, I never knew Jim as anything other than warm, kind, funny, and inviting. He was always happy to participate in whatever silly things us younger cousins were doing, like competing over who could eat the most of Bayne’s cinnamon buns at Thanksgiving or Christmas. In fact, for years he was the one continuing to bring up that competition at each holiday (even though he was pretty much never the victor). I’ll never forget hearing his distinctive laugh echoing through the house. I’m devastated Jim is gone, but I’m sure he’s now in a place where he’s always the one able to eat the most cinnamon buns.
