JANET ELIZABETH RENNIX ALLAN passed away peacefully at Bryn Mawr on Oct. 27, 2015. Born Aug. 23, 1922 to Mr. and Mrs. Wm. J Rennix of Bryn Mawr, Mrs. Allan was a life long resident of the Main Line, and a graduate of Radnor High School. Always interested in medicine, Mrs. Allan began a long career in the early 1960s as office manager and receptionist to Drs. S. L de Long, and H.J. Nealis, both on the Main Line. She was also an active volunteer at the Bryn Mawr Hospital Thrift Shop, Devon Horse Show and Country Fair, and at her church Bryn Mawr Presbyterian.

A former member of the Eastern Star, Daughters of Scotia, Springhouse, and Community Garden Club at Wayne, Mrs. Allan loved travel, visiting Ireland, Scotland, Greece, Russia and Alaska.

Known for her compassion, generosity, and ability to make friends, Mrs. Allan touched so many lives, and will be greatly missed by her sons, David G. III and Peter J Allan, both of Philadelphia, grandson Christopher P. Allan of Lancaster, Pa. sister Mary R. Redfern of Malvern, nieces, nephews, and many dear and close friends.
