Joan C. Garner, 83, of Beaumont at Bryn Mawr, died peacefully surrounded by family on March 6, 2012. Wife of the late John C. She then taught at the Caley Road School in King of Prussia for many years until her retirement in 1981. Joan traveled extensively throughout her life, and enjoyed painting and reading in her spare time. She was fortunate to have many lifelong friends and a loving family.
