John Trevor Schofield, 73, of Malvern PA, died on Thursday, November 10, 2011 at his home. Born in Manchester, England, he was the son of the late John (Jack) and Hilda Mavis Mumford-Schofield. John attended Manchester Grammar and Manchester University where he studied chemistry. He has always been a big fan of Manchester United Football. In the 1960's John worked in the chemical industry in the UK and the Netherlands for Dow, Borg Warner and Marbon. Through the first part of the 1970's he worked for Tunnel Cement and RTZ. Moving to the United States in the late 1970's John transitioned into the environmental industry setting up Stablex Corporation in Wayne, PA. He began working for IT Corporation in the 1980's and became the CEO of Thermatrix Corporation in the 1990's.

John was a member of St. David's Episcopal Church where he Initiated the "Walking the Mourner's Path" program in 2004. He became a Steven Minister, and was a member of the Men's Fellowship and sang in the Church Choir. John also held the position as Church Administrator in 2009. In addition, he served on the Board of Trustees of Community Volunteers in Medicine (CVIM) for eight years and was dedicated to serving the working poor in providing healthcare to many in our area.

John was known for his love of music and was also recognized as a “master chef” as he graciously serviced many gourmet meals to friends at home and at Church, and with his “green “thumb” has magnificent gardens within the outside his home.

John is survived by his wife, Susan Bridell West Schofield, a brother Clarence Ward Schofield, sisters Pat Spooner, Christine Margaret Williams, Ann Rose James as well as a son, Alistair John and wife Alexandria Maria Schofield of Warwick, England and daughter Karen Jane and husband David Ray Hoyt of Peachtree City, GA. His eight grandchildren include Michael, Nicole, Felicia & Christopher Hoyt of Peachtree City, GA., Samantha and Connor McClane of Boise, ID. and Guy and Johnny Schofield of Warwick, England. Relatives and friends are invited to attend his funeral service at 11:00 on Wednesday, November 16th at St. David's Episcopal Church in Wayne, Pa.
