Judith A. Zucker, 88, of Shannondell Retirement Community in Audubon, Pennsylvania, passed away peacefully on June 14, 2026 at Einstein Montgomery Hospital in East Norriton, Pennsylvania. Born on October 26, 1937, in Newark, New Jersey, she was the daughter of Kenneth and Mabel Anderson. She was preceded in death by her beloved husband, George Zucker; her daughter, Peggy Myers; and her parents.

Judith is survived by her brother, Jeffrey Anderson (Maureen); her children Susan Lima (Mike), Lee Zucker (Karen); her grandchildren Jeff Walton (Jennifer), Becca Kesler (Johnny), Dean Myers (Emily), Hanna Halpenny (Joseph), and Eric Zucker; her great-grandchildren Myles, Emma, Jack, Brooks, and Lane, plus many cherished nieces.

Known affectionately as "Judi" by family and friends, she graduated from Jonathan Dayton Regional High School in Springfield, New Jersey, Class of 1955. An outstanding student, she was a member of the Honor Society and was an active participant in the school's Glee Club. She continued her education at Susquehanna University, where she majored in mathematics. Throughout her life, Judi remained a proud and active alumna of both her high school and university, maintaining friendships and connections that spanned decades.

After marrying George in 1958, whose distinguished journalism career with The Associated Press led the family across the country, Judi became the steady force that held the family together through moves to seven different states over a 20-year period. These states included Indiana, California, Hawaii, Maryland, Tennessee, and Iowa, eventually settling in the Philadelphia area in the summer of 1978, where Judi and George would spend the remainder of their lives together.

A gifted numbers person with exceptional attention to detail, Judi built a successful career in nonprofit organizations, serving as a bookkeeper and ultimately advancing to the role of Comptroller. Following her retirement, she continued to share her talents as the longtime bookkeeper for her beloved church, St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran in Ardmore, PA, where her dedication and faithful service were deeply appreciated.

In 2012, Judi and George moved to Shannondell, where they enjoyed many happy years together until George's passing in 2020. Judi remained active and engaged, cultivating close friendships, attending family gatherings, and playing Mahjong with her friends which kept her mind as sharp as ever.

Judi was an avid reader, a woman of strong convictions, and someone who approached life with intelligence, curiosity, and compassion. She cared deeply about education, faith, and public affairs, and was never afraid to engage in thoughtful discussion on the subjects that mattered to her. She was generous with both her time and resources, supporting numerous charitable causes throughout her life.

Above all, Judi treasured the relationships she built with family, friends, neighbors, and fellow church members. Her warmth, wisdom, strength of character, and unwavering love for those around her left a lasting impression on everybody fortunate enough to know her. She will be deeply missed and lovingly remembered by her family, friends, and all whose lives she touched.
