Marc T. Mandeville, 37, of Wilmington, DE, passed away October 9th, 2010 after a courageous battle with cancer.

Born October 29, 1972 in Providence, Rhode Island, Marc was a 1990 graduate of North Smithfield High School. An avid fisherman, he received a degree in Fisheries & Marine Science from the University of Rhode Island in 1995, where he served as President of the Sigma Chi fraternity. Marc went on to receive a Master of Education degree from St Joseph's University in Philadelphia, PA.

During a ten year career at The Episcopal Academy, Marc shared his talents with countless students as a teacher, advisor and coach. Marc excelled at engaging students in the wonders of science, and delighted in observing the process of their discoveries. He also was dedicated to teaching life lessons through sports, which he accomplished during his tenure as both a high school baseball and hockey coach.

A beloved husband and father of three, Marc enjoyed spending time playing, reading and gardening with his children while he nurtured their curiosity regarding the world around them. Over the past 2 years he had become a passionate advocate of The LiveSTRONG Foundation mission, organizing a team that raised over \$250,000 this year for the Foundation to fund cancer research and provide support to survivors' and their families.

He is survived by his wife of 10 years, Megan Werner, son Christian, twin daughters Lia & Olivia, parents Elaine & Thomas, brother Peter and

grandmother Anne Mandeville.

A memorial service will take place on Saturday October 16, 2010 at 11:00am in the Class of 1944 Chapel at The Episcopal Academy, 1785 Bishop White Drive, Newtown Square, PA. 19073
