



Mary Collins Carter Warner

September 10, 1919 - June 26, 2009

Mary Collins Carter Warner died on Friday June 26th, 2009 after an extended illness. A native of Florence, Alabama. She was born in 1919 and was a graduate of Arlington Hall in Arlington, VA and attended The Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts in Philadelphia, where she studied painting with Daniel Garber and Henry McCarter. She spent summers painting at Yellow Springs and Holicong. When her fourth year at the Academy was interrupted by World War II, she went to work for the Pennsylvania Railroad.

In 1953, she married the Architect, Lincoln J. Warner and they raised two children together. Her grace and southern charm set the tone for their creative home life. She focused on her family, continued to paint, loved the shore, had a natural talent for gardening, and was a regular with her bridge group. She was a member of the Ardmore Presbyterian Church, the Fellowship of The Pennsylvania Academy and the Philadelphia Art Alliance.

She is survived by her husband of 56 years; daughter, Anne Warner; and daughter in law, Mary Jo Warner. In 2006, she was predeceased by their son, Lincoln Warner Jr.
