Maxine Tubbs Lingwall (formerly Campbell), 79, of Austin, Texas, passed away June 17, 2012 at her daughter's home in Haverford. Consistently described as a gracious and lovely woman, Maxine was kind to all and innately interested in the world around her.

She was born in Seminole, Oklahoma and raised in Mattoon, Illinois and Shreveport, Louisiana. As a teenager she mapped the progress of the troops in WWII and followed the newsreels intently. She graduated from Louisiana Tech, married, and raised two children in the Kansas City area. Always involved in her community, she was a Girl Scout leader, a League of Women Voters government observer and a Great Books participant. After divorce in her late 30's, she obtained a Master's Degree in speech pathology from the University of Kansas and had a satisfying 25-year career as a speech therapist in public schools in Shawnee Mission, Kansas; Fairfax, Virginia; and Austin, Texas.

Her second marriage to Dr. James B. Lingwall brought much joy, and later, challenge. Jim chaired the Speech and Hearing Department at the University of Kansas and they met while she was his student. His career moves later took them to the Washington, D.C. area and Austin, Texas. Maxine and Jim loved exploring the outdoors together, hiking the entire Maryland piece of the Appalachian Trail in segments, birdwatching, and visiting historic small towns

in Maryland and Texas. Maxine was an extraordinary and loving caretaker for Jim as he battled a degenerative neurological disease (PSP) through the later years of his life.

In recent years, Maxine derived much enjoyment from the University of Texas Forum, the University United Methodist Church, her long-time exercise group at the Southwest Austin YMCA, her book group, and her fellow Austin Public Schools retirees.

In addition to her sister Marian Coonrod Hern of Dallas, Maxine is survived by daughter Ann Campbell Flannery of Haverford, son Doug Campbell of Kansas City, grandchildren Carolyn, Kevin, Molly, Tom, Jill, Leigh, Ann and Peter, and many other loving relatives and friends.
