Nancy Bunce Kenly Drake, 79, of the Quadrangle, Haverford, PA, died March 9, 2008. Born October 11, 1928 in White Plains, New York, she was the daughter of Robert Gordon and Edna Lamb Bunce Kenly. She was preceded in death by her husband of 43 years, C. Daniel Drake, who died in 1991, and by her brother Bob Kenly, who died in 2005.

Nancy graduated from Bryn Mawr College in 1950 with a B.S. in biology, and earned her M.Ed. from the University of Pittsburgh in 1963. She taught 9th grade science in Radnor Township schools for 8 years.

She remained connected to her college through the lifelong friendships she formed there, as well as through her involvement with the Alumnae Office, the Owl Book Store, and through hosting international students. She was a 40-year member of Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church, where she was an elder and actively involved in the life of the church, including the Book Center and library, and the Adult Education Council.

She is survived by her children Elizabeth Drake Kimber, married to Roger, of Lancaster, PA; Virginia Cox Drake, married to Vincent Tancredi of Brooklyn, New York, and Daniel Kenly Drake, married to Susan Means Drake of Darien, CT. In addition her beloved family includes her sister-in-law Eva Kenly, nieces Jill and Tracy, and granddaughters Katherine, Emily, Kenly, Sarah and

Maggie.

A Memorial Service will be held on Sat. March 15, 2pm in the Chapel of The Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church, followed by a reception at the Church.
