



Raymond L. Weinmann

November 28, 1941 - February 17, 2021

Raymond L. Weinmann of Wynnewood, PA passed away peacefully on February 17, 2021 after a brief illness. He was 79.

Born in Philadelphia, to Bertha and Ludwig Weinmann, he attended LaSalle College High School, was an All-Catholic tight end for LaSalle's championship football teams of 1957 and 1958. He also graduated with a degree in Architecture from the University of Notre Dame in 1964.

A builder/developer, Ray was the co-founder of Meehan-Weinmann, Inc. a building and construction management company which pioneered the redevelopment of Conshohocken, PA. He was also a former director of Prime Bank, the Philadelphia Protestant Home and a member of Carpenters Hall. A lifelong Fighting Irish football fan, he instilled a love of skiing and a passion for soulful music in his children and grandchildren. He also leaves behind the legacy of "Conshohocken means Business."

Ray is survived by his four children: Christina, Ray (Darlene), Erika Whisted (Paul) and Mark (Lauren) and their families including 11 grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren. He is also survived by his sister, Marian Boess-Winter and former wife, Mimi Ludwig Weinmann.
