



Thomas Lloyd Carter M.D.

June 8, 1930 - June 8, 2012

Thomas L. Carter, MD, of Gladwyne, PA, departed this earthly life on June 8, 2012, at Bryn Mawr Hospital, in Bryn Mawr, PA, on the occasion of his 82nd birthday. He was a generous humanitarian with a passionate Christian faith who devoted much of his time and finances to charitable causes. His contributions have helped establish churches in California and Pennsylvania, as well as provide medical care and aid to those in countries around the world.

Dr. Carter attended Upper Darby High School as a member of the class of 1948 and matriculated to Harvard University, graduating in 1952. He completed medical school at Jefferson Medical College in 1956, and honorably served his country in the United States Navy for 8 years in Aviation Medicine. Dr. Carter was Board Certified in Radiology after a Fellowship at Mayo Clinic, Rochester, MN, and Nuclear Medicine after a Fellowship at the University of California, San Francisco. Dr. Carter's clinical practice in California and Pennsylvania spanned 50 years, touching many lives with his diagnostic acumen and gentle care. His medical legacy is also distinguished by his example to his four sons, all of whom graduated from Jefferson Medical College, and continue the calling to assist those in need.

Dr. Carter is survived by his wife of 55 years, Lenora Reinhart Carter, his four sons, Thomas, [r., (Deborah Bartleson) W. Bradford (Janie Huff), Stephen L. (Tiffany Newhouse), and David L. (Barbara Steininger), and his 8 grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents Dr. William E. Carter (Margaret Lineman), and brothers W. Neal (Jefferson Medical College, Class of 1955) of Merced, CA, and CAPT Donald G. (USA) of Virginia Beach, VA.

Services will be held at 11 AM, Thursday, June 14, 2012 at Church on the Hill, 221 Ashland Avenue, Bala Cynwyd, PA, preceded by a visiting hour from IOAM to 11 AM. Interment will be at Calvary Cemetery.
