Torgny Daniel Gustafsson (1946-2024)

Torgny Daniel Gustafsson died on May 31, 2024 at the age of 77 of a ruptured aortic aneurysm at Lankenau Hospital. He is survived by his wife, Ingrid; their four children Marcus (Diana), Lovisa, Hanna (Jacob), and Andreas; his adored grandchildren Milo, Sebastian, Penelope, and Violet; and his siblings Bjorn, Bo, and Ingrid.

Torgny was born in Halmstad, Sweden and grew up in Kinnared and Stromstad. He studied physics and musicology at Chalmers University in Gothenburg and after earning his PhD in physics he moved to Philadelphia, PA in 1974. His two year US post-doc at The University of Pennsylvania became a permanent move when he became a faculty member in 1976, moving through the ranks from Assistant to Associate to Full Professor of Physics. He moved to Rutgers University in 1987 as Distinguished Professor of Physics and helped establish the Rutgers Laboratory for Surface Modification. During his time at Rutgers he served Chair of the Department of Physics and Astronomy and later as Director of the Rutgers Laboratory for Surface Modification until 2019 when he retired as Distinguished Professor Emeritus. During his scientific career, Torgny pioneered many new experimental techniques such as photoelectron spectroscopy, ion beam spectrometry, and advance microscopies, applying them to the study of solid

surfaces, interfaces, thin films, and nanostructures. From 2010 until his death he served on the Franklin Institute's Committee on Science and the Arts. He not only loved science, but the places to which his job enabled him to travel and the people with whom he was able to collaborate.

Torgny loved anything that brought the whole family together, whether a week at the beach, a milestone birthday, or a family trip to Europe. After his retirement from his scientific career, he embarked on his second "highly successful" career as a grandfather and he'd often remark that his grandchildren were "just fantastic." Aside from his grandchildren, his greatest joys were listening to opera, traveling to new countries, and drinking bold red wine. His large personal library reflects these loves as well as his perennial curiosity and desire to expand his horizons, both metaphorical and literal.

As a child in rural Sweden Torgny would read atlases and longed to experience the many fantastic sceneries, cultures, and peoples around the planet. Luckily, his profession took him to many of the places he dreamt of going as a child, and as time passed he found new places to dream to go with the frequent flier miles he accrued. His appetite for new places and new experiences was never satisfied as he found new things to marvel at.

Upon experiencing a new city or taking in a beautiful vista, he'd often whisper "what have I done to deserve this?"--always humble about his contributions and grateful for his opportunities in life.

A Memorial Service will be held Tuesday June 25th at 11 am at Saint Paul's Lutheran Church, 415 E Athens Ave, Ardmore PA 19003, followed by a reception. The family will receive guests from 10:30 am.
