WILLIAM LACY CONRAD, 71, DIED ON APRIL 8, 2025, FOLLOWING A BRIEF ILLNESS. HE WAS BORN ON NOVEMBER 11, 1953 IN CHESTNUT HILL, PA. HE WAS THE SON OF KATHERINE W. AND ANTHONY L. CONRAD. HE IS SURVIVED BY HIS WIFE OF 42 YEARS, JOANNE HODGES CONRAD, HIS TWO CHILDREN, ANDREW F. CONRAD (MAGGIE) OF NEW YORK CITY AND C. QUINCY CONRAD (WARREN SCOTT) OF BRYN MAWR, AND HIS GRANDSON, OTTO B. SCOTT. HE IS ALSO SURVIVED BY HIS BROTHER, ANTHONY L. CONRAD, III, HIS COUSIN, CHARLES W. CONRAD, AND WAS PREDECEASED BY HIS SISTER, CATHERINE F. CONRAD.

BILL GRADUATED FROM CHESTNUT HILL ACADEMY AND GEORGETOWN UNIVERSITY.

IN HIS PROFESSIONAL CAREER HE WORKED IN THE INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT BUSINESS. HE WORKED AT DELAWARE INVESTMENTS UNTIL HIS RETIREMENT. PRIOR TO THAT HE WAS WITH RITTENHOUSE ASSET MANAGEMENT AND NUVEEN INVESTMENTS. HE ENJOYED A POST RETIREMENT ASSOCIATION WITH THE HORTON FUND IN PHILADELPHIA.

BILL SERVED AS CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF THE MAGEE REHABILITATION HOSPITAL FOUNDATION FOR 14 YEARS. HE SERVED

ON THE BOARDS OF THE CHRISTOPHER LUDWICK FOUNDATION, THE PENN MUSEUM, AND THE UNITED WAY OF GREATER PHILADELPHIA AND SOUTHERN NEW JERSEY.

BILL WAS A LOVING AND GENEROUS MAN. HE ADORED HIS FAMILY AND FRIENDS. HE HAD MANY INTERESTS AND HOBBIES AND WAS HAPPIEST WHEN HE WAS IN HIS GARDEN, ON A TROUT STREAM OR DOING FOR OTHERS.
