



## Winfield Albright Scott

February 27, 1914 - November 17, 2010

Winfield Albright Scott, 96, passed away November 17, 2010 at Waverly Heights, a retirement community in Gladwyne, Pennsylvania.

Winfield Scott (Win) was born February 27, 1914 in West Philadelphia as the only son of Winfield and Sally Rose Albright Scott. He lived most of his life in the Philadelphia area and vacationed at the Adirondack family retreat on Lake George in Hague, New York.

He graduated from Drexel University in 1937 with a BS degree in Mechanical Engineering where he was elected president of the student body and was a Reserve Officer Training Corps member. He joined the Bell Telephone Company where he remained for 40 years assuming increasingly responsible positions in Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, and New York City. He retired as Vice President and General Manager of Bell Telephone Company of Pennsylvania in 1977.

Win served in the Army during World War II in numerous locations in the United States and Europe and earned the rank of Lieutenant Colonel in the Ordnance Department.

He was active with the Valley Forge Council of the Boy Scouts of America and received the Silver Beaver Award, one of the highest rewards in Scouting, for his service. His three sons are all Eagle Scouts. He was also a long-standing member of the Free Masons. An avid reader across many disciplines, he was skilled in building construction, automotive mechanics, and electronics.

He met the love of his life, Florence Madeline Hauber, at a dance organized by the nursing school of the Perth Amboy General Hospital in New Jersey while he was a young Army officer stationed at the Raritan Arsenal. They married on May 3, 1944 in Jackson, Mississippi and, earlier this year, celebrated 66 years of marriage.

He was steadfastly devoted to his family, instilling strong values of honesty, loyalty, self-reliance, and hard work.

Surviving are his devoted wife Florence; sons Donald, Kenneth, and Richard; daughter Christine; daughters-in-law Joan, Susan, and Rebecca; son-in-law Richard Oliver; nine grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren.
